Legal and child advocates walked alongside her, offering options and guidance that empowered her to make informed decisions, ensuring that her future would be one filled with hope and opportunity. 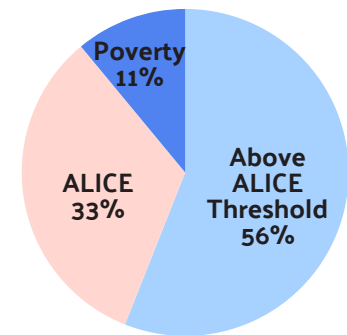

Designed to keep families in their homes and their children in their school of origin to allow them to succeed | Case managers work with families for up to 18 months to create an intensive plan to help the family stabilize and thrive

IDA PROJECT

A matched-savings account program helping low-income individuals purchase long-term assets

THRIVING AFRICAN-AMERICAN SMALL BUSINESS INITIATIVE

A small business investment and education program aimed at closing the racial wealth gap and addressing barriers faced by small Black-owned businesses

RISE INVESTMENT PROGRAM

Designed to address the ongoing challenges experienced by ALICE households in Southeast Louisiana | The program distributes seed investment grants to participant's investment accounts and provides access to financial wellness education and other resources to help increase their investing confidence, financial wellness, and long-term wealth
